Mission Statement

The mandate of the Edmonton Bicycle Commuters' Society (EBC) is to make every day cycling in Edmonton safer and more widespread by providing bicycle services, resources, education and advocacy. We promote the bicycle as a healthy, economical and ecologically sound mode of travel.

Objectives

This year, the Board of Directors has proposed to update our objectives to better reflect EBC's present goals and activities and our vision for the organization's future. These new objectives would be:

1. To provide, administer and maintain a multi-use facility for Edmonton and area dedicated to providing cost-effective, do-it-yourself bike repair facilities and access to economical means of transportation.
2. To educate the public by providing courses, seminars and workshops about bike mechanics and/or safe and effective riding.
3. To extend services to marginalized members of the community as well as new-comers.
4. Work to facilitate communication between cyclists and governments or others to improve bicycle infrastructure.
5. To assist the Edmonton community at large in the promotion, encouragement and understanding of all aspects of cycling culture.

Report from the President

For several years I've been stating that EBC is "more than just BikeWorks", but the accuracy of that has been a matter of degrees. This past year, I think that we've made significant progress towards expanding our scope. We've developed new partnerships with universities and student groups, businesses and government, and non-profit organizations. The goal of these new relationships is to become a more sustainable and meaningful resource to the cycling community in Edmonton. We're exposed to new people, volunteers, funding, and ideas, and through our outreach we become relevant to the wider community in Edmonton.



The challenge this year was to move the Board from an administrative to a policy governance model. We have created full-time permanent positions of Executive Director and BikeWorks Coordinator, both responsible for the daily operations of the organization.

Meanwhile, we launched a new marketing campaign to promote cycling and EBC; continue to expand and diversify our educational offerings; are mounting a concerted election campaign; applied for space for a new BikeWorks location; transitioned BikeWorks into a successful volunteer-run shop; and still regularly run or participate in events across the city. We even hosted a few parties.

Over 700 people joined EBC or renewed their memberships this past year. As our organization grows into its 30th year, our voice grows. There's still a lot of work to do, but thanks to the dedication and work of all our staff, our volunteers at BikeWorks and beyond, and the Board, I think we're headed in the right direction.

BikeWorks Operations

This summer, **BikeWorks moved from being staffed by paid mechanics to being staffed by volunteers.** At the same time, revenue grew from \$33 thousand in the previous year to nearly \$55 thousand. BikeWorks recorded over 2400 visits and tripled its regular volunteer-base to 30 individuals, who collectively contributed about 1300 hours of their time.

In an effort to make our space more inviting and inclusive, **BikeWorks extended its women and transgendered shop days** to include every first, third and fifth Sunday of each month. The shop is operated only by women and transgendered persons on those days.

A **bike rental program**, funded with the assistance of an \$8050 grant from [Mountain Equipment Co-op](#), is being developed and operated by EBC. Over the winter, we plan to build up bikes for the rental program (as well as for sale) and launch in spring. Our regular bike-building nights are just starting, but are already very popular!

We offered basic bike mechanic courses to over 110 people this summer alone, not including another 120 hours of volunteer mechanic training. In addition to basic and advanced mechanic courses, BikeWorks hosted courses on DIY retroreflective clothing, electronics and bike light building, winter riding, and tire studding. Every workshop was repeated to meet high demand.

BikeWorks diverts a significant amount of material from the waste stream. Much of what comes into our shop ends up back on the road. We refurbish and reuse whatever we can. **The rest is recycled: about 10,000 pounds of scrap metal and nearly 2000 pounds of tire and tube rubber this year.**

In addition to training, lack of clear policies has been a consistent issue at BikeWorks in the past. A draft policy and training handbook has been completed, and training will roll out this winter. Part of this training will cover the move to a new, **computerized point-of-sales system** that has been developed for BikeWorks with the help of students from the University of Alberta.

One aspect of BikeWorks that can't be quantified is its atmosphere. With continual renovations to the physical facility, including fresh paint, shelving, and better labels and signs, as well as the welcoming social atmosphere, people that perhaps avoided the space before now look forward to their visits, wanting to **see the latest improvements and meet the newest volunteers.**

Non-BikeWorks Operations

Outreach

EBC has provided the mechanics, tools and supplies to run weekly **outreach repair in inner-city**. This service aims to make much needed bike repair services available to poor and marginalized Edmontonians, many of whom rely on bicycles to get around. These repair sessions alternate every week between two inner-city agencies to maximize EBC's presence and help as many people as possible.

We have also provided the same for **The Spoke**, a new program that focuses on teaching bike mechanic skills to marginalized youth. Located in the *Alberta Cycle* building on 118 Ave, The Spoke has already helped 6 youth build and take home bicycles and is currently mentoring a new group of youth.

Events

This year saw many new and emerging cycling events that EBC initiated or supported: a symphony ride, grocery tours, Critical Lass, perogy rides, tweed rides and bicycle polo—all promoting a culture that accepts the bicycle as a useful tool for recreation, style, and everyday living. We continued to provide monitored bicycle parking at various festivals, and are deeply involved in conducting Bike Month. EBC also participated in numerous events coordinated by various universities and community leagues.

Education

In an effort to encourage effective cycling and help cyclists feel more comfortable riding in traffic, EBC offers **CAN-BIKE II on-road cycling courses**. This year, all of our courses (including a course to train more instructors) were filled to capacity. Next year, with several new instructors, we hope to offer even more courses. We also produced flexible "**Lunch Box**" **presentations on cycle commuting** that can be given to downtown offices, secondary schools, and other interested groups

Partnerships

At the University of Alberta, EBC has been working with ECOS, the International Centre, Community Service Learning, and Student Legal Services on various projects. Bike Month saw a large boost in attendance thanks to a partnership between NextGen, EFCL and EBC during their Community Challenge. We hope to expand our sponsorship and partnership arrangements in the coming year to include **newcomers groups** and groups representing marginalized communities. We have also begun establishing formal relationships with bike shops, and setting up a **Bike Friendly Business** program in cooperation with the City. We're hoping to produce a downtown bicycle parking map, too.

Advocacy

This year, EBC went to City Hall several times to advocate on behalf of city cyclists. At the Transportation and Public Works Committee hearings on Active Transportation, we had many speakers discuss the importance of good bike infrastructure. The resulting motions recommended **increasing funding for active transportation from 1.15% to 5% of the transportation budget**. EBC also met with Mayor Stephen Mandel to discuss cycling issues in the city, and we maintain close connections with the Transportation department and have a seat on the [Trails, Paths & Routes Advisory Committee \(TPRAC\)](#).

Ad agency [DDB Canada](#) generously provided EBC with about \$22000 in free marketing work to launch a new marketing campaign, aimed at getting people to think about bikes as very personal items, and to discover EBC through the dingding.ca website. The campaign includes print and radio ads, bicycle displays that can be taken to events or parked on sidewalks, pins, and a website. While the initial launch is mostly used to catch the eye and present the bicycle as something more than just a toy or sports equipment, the plan is to partner with local bike shops and re-launch the campaign in spring with a very local, very personal focus.

In conjunction with the municipal election scheduled for October 2010, EBC's advocacy committee developed a lobby document and launched a website that provides voters with a single source to see candidate positions on cycling issues. The site also provides voters with sample letters and candidate contact info so that citizens can ensure that their concerns are being heard and discussed.

Charitable status

EBC has begun the process of becoming a charity. Charitable status will grant us access to many more sources of funding, and give us the ability to give tax receipts to donors.
